Times of the school day

Spelling in school

We have recently revised how we teach spellings in school as part of our continued focus on Writing. You should all have received a letter giving details. There will now be a variety of ways of checking spelling knowledge in school ranging from a traditional test, jumbled words, correcting a passage, cloze procedure and word quizzes and games.



Safeguarding at Uplands

The Safeguarding of our pupils is the highest priority at Uplands. Through this Newsletter I will give out information that you may find helpful in order for us to work together to keep children safe.

Designated Safeguarding lead

All schools have a named lead who takes responsibility for Safeguarding and Child Protection including online safety. Our lead is myself-Mrs Webster-Smith and my deputies are Mrs Walker, Mrs Shakesheave and Mrs Roberts. Together we make up the Safeguarding team and all children are taught this and reminded regularly. In addition Mrs Devi is our online safety coordinator. Although we have named leads it is the responsibility of ALL staff to Safeguard children and everyone is provided with regular training and updates in this area.

Every year the Government publish "Keeping children safe in education KCSIE" and this is the baseline for all of our work. A detailed policy is written every September using KCSIE and this has to be approved by our Governors. This can be found on our website along with a link to KCSIE 2023. Their definition of Safeguarding in KCSIE is:

- ⇒ protecting children from maltreatment
- ⇒ preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development
- ⇒ ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care,
- ⇒ taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

There is a section on our website called "Safeguarding" which is full of information and signposts

Junior Duke

We are delighted this year to be offering the opportunity for new Year 3 pupils to join the Junior Duke award. This is a life skills award which leads children through set challenges helping them to grow in independence, confidence and resilience. Year 3 parents/carers should have received a letter about this with a consent form. Miss Richards our PE champion is leading on this and will be signing off pupils' work over the year.

Playtime snacks

Children may bring in a snack to eat at playtime. Please can you ensure that this is "healthy" such as fruit, salad vegetables, cereal bar (no nuts) and not sweets, chocolate, biscuits or crisps. Please may I remind you that we are a "nut free" school due to allergies.

Whole class instrument teaching (WCIT)



We are delighted to once again be offering Whole class instrument teaching to all **Year 4** classes as their Music curriculum. This involves all pupils learning how to play the ukulele and learning all of their music skills through this. Pupils will loan an instrument from Wolverhampton music school which they will be able to bring home and then there will

be a weekly class lesson. This is all fully funded for the pupils. Next Summer there will then be a musical showcase so they can share their learning with you. Years 3, 5 and 6 will be using Kapow Music for their music curriculum

lessons.
